There are 4 options with regard to the payment of tuition fees:

* Monthly payments – payable over 10 months (due on the first day of each month, January to October)

** Termly payments due first day of each term (1 Jan, 1 Apr, 1 Jul, 1 Oct)

*** Annual payment paid by 15th November of prior year (6.25% discount included)

**** Annual payment paid by 15th January of current (5% discount included)

Monthly payments – payable over 12 months by special arrangement only (due on the first day of each month, January to December)

All quoted fees include early payment discounts.

Payments to the school are required to be gross of payment gateway transaction costs.

Included in the fees

Tuition Fees are inclusive of all innings, outings, compulsory sport, wifi and printing at school, teaching resources, a daily cooked lunch and annual family membership to BSA. One Evolve Academy T-shirt is provided to new students (additional uniform can be purchased separately).

Textbooks and stationery

Parents are responsible for the purchase of textbooks which support the curriculum and exercise books and stationery items as per list provided.

External examinations

Parents are responsible for the cost of all external examination fees.

Devices and software:

All students are required to bring a laptop operating Windows. The device's administration rights are required to be signed over to the school for management purposes. Devices are brought to school at own risk. Device specifications will be provided.

Additional obligatory incidental fees

Other costs that you may incur include: IGCSE Art & Design student supplies, remedial specialists, facilitators, invigilators, technology devices and software, calculators, elective extra-mural activities, elective meals, camps, workshops, career advisement assessments, bus transport, additional uniform, school photographs, aftercare, holiday care.

Late collections

For late collection there is a charge of R115 per hour or part thereof.

Extra Mural Fees

Extra mural activities are optional. Certain sports and hobbies may incur additional fees (e.g. hockey astro fees) and require specialist sports equipment.

Late payments

Fees received after the 1st of each month will be subject to a late payment fee of R500 per month and interest on outstanding balances will be charged at Prime + 2%, per month. Should fees be outstanding in full or part for one or more months the child/children may be suspended from school. Should fees be outstanding in full or part for two or more months the outstanding account may be handed over to debt recovery attorneys.

Notice

One full term's notice (3 months) of intent to leave the School must be given in writing by the 1st day of the term, or pay a full term's fees in lieu of notice. Notice must be sent to the admin@evolveacademy.co.za

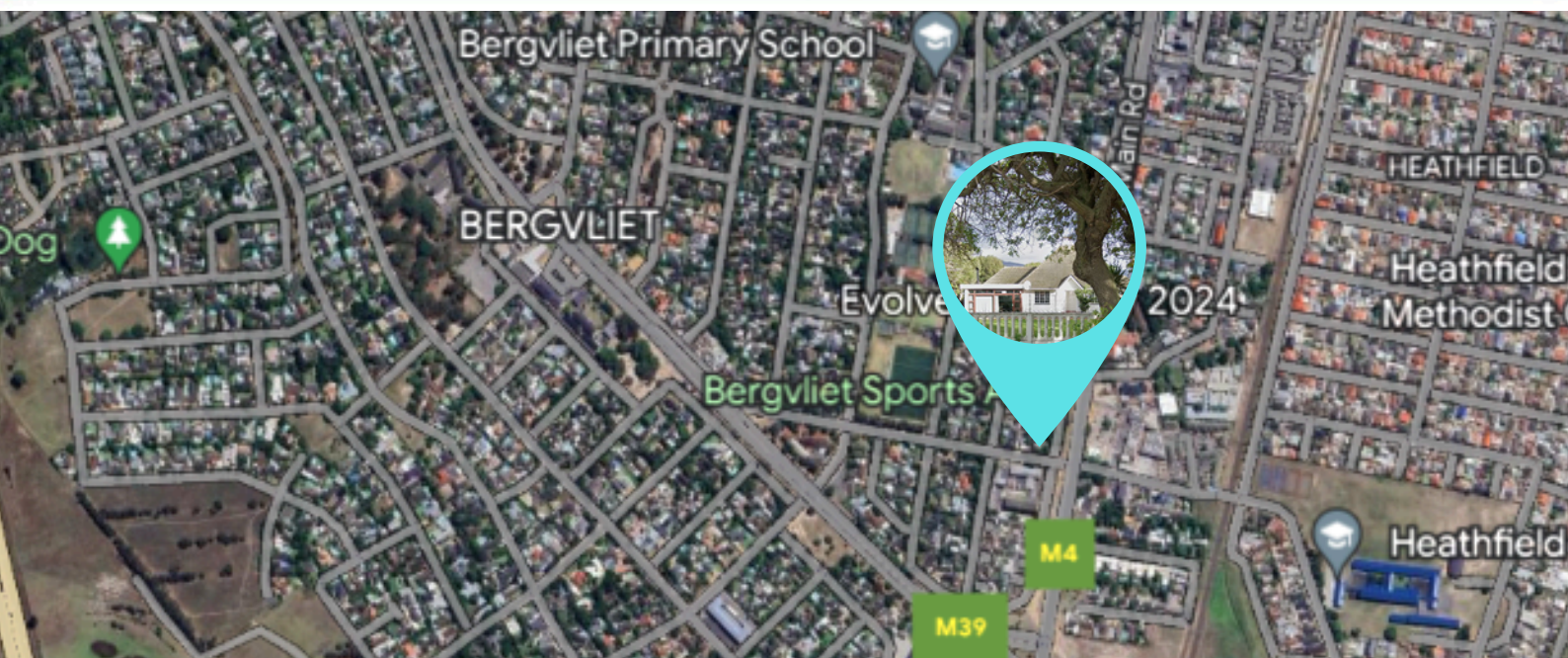
